UMSL is celebrating Governor Mike Parson's signing of the FY23 state budget on June 30. This budget contains an unprecedented level of funding for public higher education, including a one-time appropriation of \$40 million for UMSL, which will support the transition of our campus beginning with the consolidation of the university's academic core on the North Campus and the establishment of the North County Business and Workforce District on the South Campus. Learn more here. The St. Louis County Council is currently considering the south campus project as one of the projects funded with their remaining ARPA dollars. More to come as this develops.

College of Education hosts inaugural Future Teacher Leadership Academy for local high school students

LaChe' Smith was one of a dozen students diligently brainstorming during a June morning in the Ed Collabitat at the University of Missouri–St. Louis. She and her peers had a task: discuss common classroom expectations for educators and examine how those expectations can sometimes be detrimental and, subsequently, reimagined. They eagerly bounced ideas off of each other, documenting them on a handful of whiteboards scattered throughout the room, before sharing with everyone. "We talk a lot about implicit bias, and I think that's really important to learn, especially going into a teaching career," Smith said, referring to the day's discussion.

The scene was part of UMSL's inaugural Future Teacher Leadership Academy. The free two-week program, which ran from June 13-24, aimed to encourage high school students in the St. Louis region to envision careers in education. The program is a joint effort between the College of Education and the UMSL Office of Precollegiate Services and was funded primarily through a \$30,000 grant from the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.

The first FTLA group represented a broad socioeconomic and geographic spectrum, including 11 high school students and one recent high school graduate from the Ferguson-Florissant School District. <u>Read more</u>.

The St. Louis County Board of Elections office is now available for casting or returning absentee ballots for the August primary election. Beginning July 21, six additional satellite sites will also be available including the UMSL Millennium Student Center located at 17 Arnold Grobman Dr, 63121.

The UMSL location will also serve as a polling place on Election Day, August 2, 2022. Voters in St. Louis County may vote at any polling place in the County on Election Day. Polling places are open from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. Voters in line at the closing time of 7:00 p.m. have the right to cast a vote.
