



B Juiced juice bar opening in Ferguson in 2023

Brandace Johnson plans to open a juice bar in Ferguson next year. B Juiced—Johnson's line of handcrafted, raw, organic cold-pressed juices—will expand to a brick-and-mortar, slated to open on April 1 at 605 S. Florissant. The decision comes after Johnson was recently awarded a \$50,000 grant from <u>UMSL Accelerate</u>. In addition to juices, smoothies, and smoothie bowls, the juice bar will offer a small menu with such dishes as avocado toast, waffles, and salads.

Prior to applying for the UMSL Accelerate program, Johnson had been selling B Juiced out of a trailer at the Ferguson Farmers' Market and events across North County. In late 2020, after Johnson got COVID-19, she sought out juices while recovering. Although she found a juice bar that delivered, the company didn't deliver to her neighborhood near UMSL's campus. Johnson decided to make her own juices and ensure they would be available in areas where there are fewer healthy options, such as Ferguson. About a year into operations, Jada Huffman, a friend from middle school, joined Johnson as a business partner, and it's been a "two-woman show" ever since. <u>Read more</u>.

Jennings School District starts Early Childhood Fine Arts Department to help young learners benefit from engaging in the arts

Studies show that students engaging in arts education experience multiple benefits including higher academic performance, lower dropout rates and increased self-esteem. Research regarding arts education for early childhood students has shown it can help them cultivate critical abilities such as enhanced cognitive skills and provide benefits in emotional and social development.

Arts in education was first introduced into public school curriculum in 1821. Massachusetts was the first state to integrate arts education into the general education pro-gram in 1860. It wasn't until 1990 that the Missouri Arts Education Task Force "established a comprehensive plan to include the arts as a basic component of every child's education."

The Jennings school district recognizes the importance of the arts in education, particularly for young learners and recently created an Early Childhood Fine Arts Department. <u>Read more</u>.
